



A jury is designed to
protect society from lawbreakers, but it is also a means to
protect society from bad law

Jury independence is your power to
judge the law as well as the evidence

Since it has a
conscience

**A jury can nullify a law
that it believes is unjust**

No matter what the evidence, it's your moral obligation and natural right to
declare the defendants of non-violent
drug charges **NOT GUILTY!**

Judges are not required to inform you of

Jury Nullification Power!

In many jurisdictions it is **forbidden** for
attorneys to advise a jury of the possibility, and jurors must
learn of it through extra-legal sources - like this art.

Fear of jury anarchy guides
such restrictions, and there are examples of nullifica-
tion gone awry (e.g., racist juries refusing to convict
white supremacists for killing black people)
